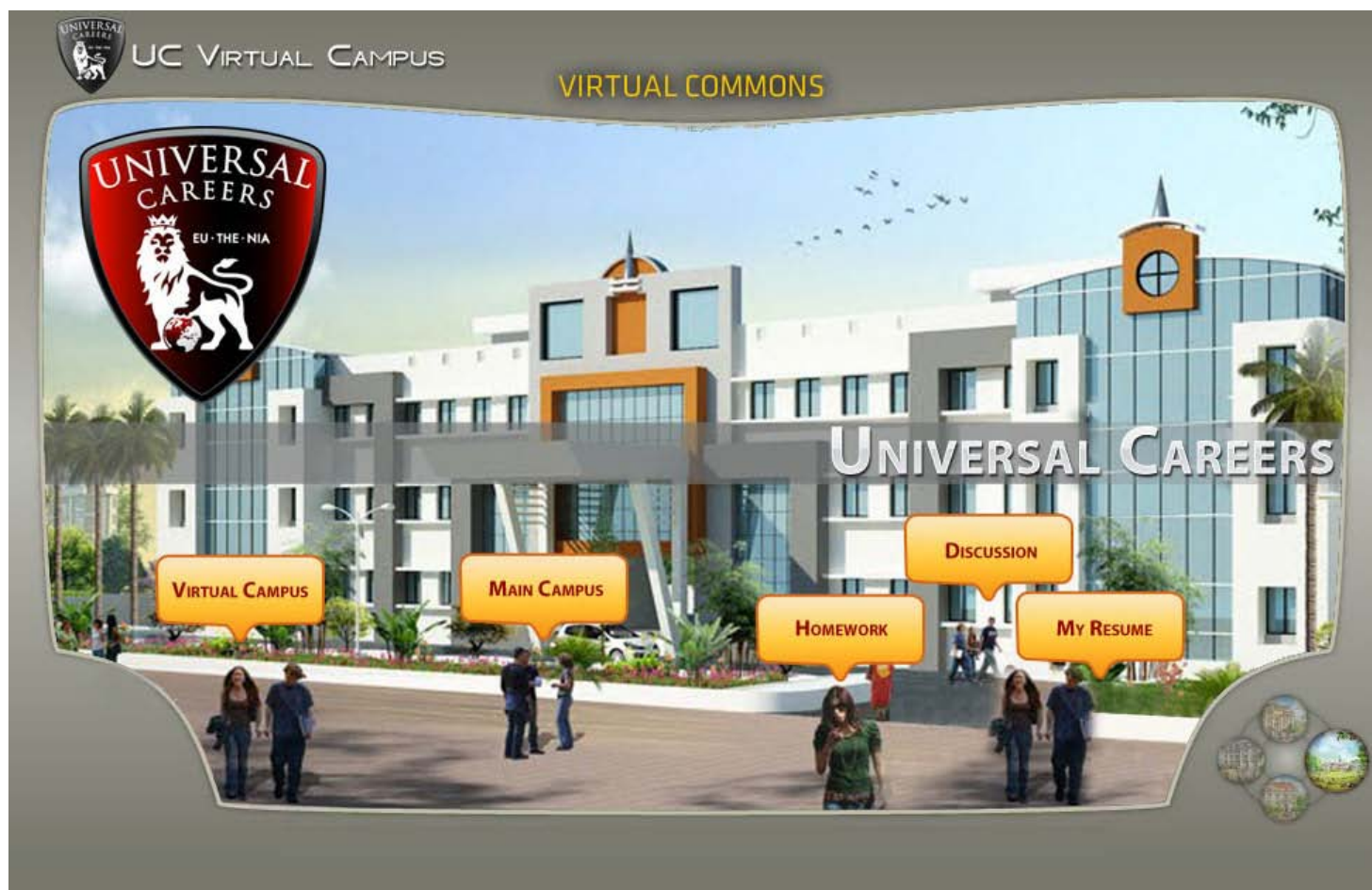

Step3: After you get your book, please call us at 1-213-290-4682 so we can give you access to the Universal Careers Virtual Campus so you can start the online portion of your training. You must pass the online training with a GPA of 3.00 before we can schedule you for the 14 day training. You can take the test in the UC Virtual Campus as many times as you want until you get a 3.00 GPA.





Step4: Once you graduate the online portion of the National EMT Certification program with a minimum of 3.00 GPA, please call us at 1-213-290-4682 to schedule your arrival date and time in Bloomington, Indiana. Please do not purchase your plane ticket before we give you a confirmation number because the location of your training may change. After we give you your confirmation number, you may order your plane ticket.

Step5: Go through the 14 days training; work in an emergency room for 8 hours and work on an ambulance for 8 hours so you see exactly what it is like to work with paramedics. Then take the NREMT test and get your national certification and state license.

Meals

Too keep the cost for you as low as possible, only breakfast is provided by the hotel which consists of bread and cereal. There is however a fully equipped kitchen in every room which consist of a refrigerator, microwave, toaster and oven. So if you would like to cook you can as well. There are also many local restaurants and fast food that you can go to. During the clinical phase of your training where you will be in an actual emergency room and on an actual ambulance, please bring sufficient funds to purchase food or plan to bring your lunch to the clinical setting. Alcoholic beverages are not allowed at any time during your stay at the hotel.



Laundry

Please be advised that you may need to bring enough clothes for two weeks. There are a few coined washer and dryer at the hotel that you can use if you would like to wash your clothes.
